CASE MATRIX FOR CASE PRESENTATIONS

Candidates should submit cases that when considered in totality cover as many aspects of the case matrix as possible, thus demonstrating across all 3 cases a broad range of clinical and patient management skills for different stages of developing dentitions in children. Cases should demonstrate skills expected of a specialist in paediatric dentistry. The Case Matrix may be useful as an aide memoire to note the aspects covered by the cases being submitted.
