



Surgery is essential for global cancer care in all resource settings. Of the 15-2 million ner over 80% of cases will need surgery, some several times. By 2030, we estimate that any procedures will be needed worldwide. Yet, less than 25% of patients with cancer worldwide a or timely surgery. Solutions include better re international partnerships, super-centralisation of surgical services, novel surgical clinical t to improve quality and scale up cancer surgical systems through education and trainin directed at many global stakeholders, but the central message is that to deliver safe, affo surgery to all, surgery must be at the heart of global and national cancer control planning.


